Mission Statement

Inspired by Gospel values, the members and staff of the Dayton District Council, through its Conferences and Special Works, grow in spirituality by providing person-to-person emergency assistance and supportive services to the poor, homeless, and unemployed populations of our community, as well as to people who need assistance during unexpected life crises.

2008 Key Accomplishments

In 2008, approximately 45,000 individuals were impacted by the generous support of our donors. From the work of our Conferences who help the impoverished in their communities, to our Special Works programs assisting the homeless in returning to stable housing, this is how we are making a difference in the lives of our neighbors:

- Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Dayton District Council through 35 conferences provided more than one million dollars in emergency assistance to more than 36,000 individuals.
- St. Vincent de Paul Hotel Gateway Shelter homeless shelter provided hot meals, showers, personal care items, clothing and a safe and warm place to sleep to more than 3,600 individuals, including nearly 700 children. This represents close to 91,000 units (24-hour period) of service.
- St. Vincent DePaul Center served 64 homeless men with transitional and permanent housing services throughout the year, resulting in 19 men moving into fair market permanent housing and two residing in Section 8 subsidized housing.
- St. Vincent de Paul Supportive Housing offered transitional and permanent housing services to 44 homeless families with 81 children and 5 single women. Nineteen households successfully completed the program with five now in fair market permanent housing and the remainder in subsidized housing units.
- St. Vincent de Paul SafeHaven served 16 homeless men this past year. Two participants successfully left the program and moved into their own apartments this year.
- St. Vincent de Paul Community Store provided at no cost items totaling more than \$152,000 to members of our community referred by our Conferences, Gateway Shelter and Housing programs. Clothing, household items and furniture were provided for over 500 families including 1,273 children.
- St. Vincent de Paul Community Food Pantry serves on average 2,800 individuals by providing fresh and non-perishable groceries twice a month.
