Mission Statement

Inspired by Gospel values, the members and staff of the Dayton District Council, through its Conferences and Special Works, grow in spirituality by providing person-to-person emergency assistance and supportive services to the poor, homeless, and unemployed populations of our community, as well as to people who need assistance during unexpected life crises.

2009 Key Accomplishments

In 2009, over 80,000 individuals were impacted by the generous support of our donors. From the work of our Conferences who help the impoverished in their communities, to our Special Works programs assisting the homeless in returning to stable housing, this is how we are making a difference in the lives of our neighbors:

- Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Dayton District Council through 36 conferences provided more than one million dollars in emergency assistance to more than 76,000 individuals.
- Gettysburg Gateway for Men opened in November, 2009 and along with the St. Vincent de Paul Hotel Gateway Shelter for Women & Families provided hot meals, showers, personal care items, clothing and a safe and warm place to sleep to more than 4,100 homeless individuals, including 752 children. This represents over 104,000 units (24-hour period) of service.
- Transitional and Permanent Supportive Housing Programs including the St. Vincent DePaul Center for Men, St. Vincent de Paul Transitional Supportive Housing Programs for Women and Families, St. Vincent de Paul Kettering Commons, and St. Vincent de Paul Safe Haven provided housing, case management services and life skill training to 116 formerly homeless men and women. The families participating had 113 children who were able to transition from living at our Hotel to a stable housing environment.
- St. Vincent de Paul Community Store provided at no cost items totaling more than \$160,000 to members of our community referred by our Conferences, Gateway Shelter and Housing programs. Clothing, household items and furniture were provided for over 700 families and over 1,200 children. It also opened the Deconstruction Depot in November, 2009 which sells vintage building materials salvaged from vacant, nuisance properties being deconstructed by our partners in Dayton Works Plus.
- St. Vincent de Paul Community Food Pantry served 26,974 people 242,766 meals by providing fresh and non-perishable groceries twice a month.
